**Am I eligible to participate in these courses?**

Only enlisted members of the US Armed Forces (Active Duty, Air Reserve Component & Air National Guard) who are enrolled in the Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) program are eligible to take these courses.

**How much will these courses cost me?**

Nothing. There is no cost.

**I've taken the ADLS 'Culture General' Course already. Aren't these the same?**

Absolutely not. ADLS courses are formulated as training material. These are college level courses and require increased commitment on your part. They present more sophisticated concepts which will require more effort to comprehend and apply the knowledge. As a practical matter, you will be expected to read a greater volume of material, the material will be more demanding and quizzes and exams will require greater understanding to pass.

**What kind of academic credit do these courses provide?**

These general education courses provides 3 semester hours of social science credit. If you have already earned your CCAF social science credit, they can be applied to meet the CCAF program elective credit requirement.

**Will these courses fulfill a humanities or speech requirement?**

No. These courses will only fulfill a Social Science or CCAF program elective requirement.

**Will these courses fulfill a residency requirement?**

Yes. Each of these courses meet 3 hours of your CCAF residency requirement.

**Will the academic credit I earn in these courses be accepted at the college I'm attending?**

That depends on the institution. Usually the school in question will require an official course number and course description be submitted to them for evaluation.

A number of our students have successfully submitted these courses for academic credit at other universities. Air University (AU) is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and the Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) has determined these courses has sufficient academic rigor to include on the transcript of your education record.

**I've already completed my CCAF degree. Can I still take these courses?**

Yes.

**How many courses does AFCLC offer to meet CCAF academic requirements?**

AFCLC offers both the CLTR201 Introduction To Culture (ITC) Course, and CLTR202 Introduction to Cross-Cultural Communication (CCC). Both provide social science credit and are general education

**Is one of these courses a prerequisite for the other?**

No.

**I've never taken an "online" course before. What should I expect?**

These courses are delivered through a learning management system (LMS) called Blackboard. You will use a username and password to login to the LMS and access the course materials. Typically the course's academic modules consist of a 'core concepts' presentation, multimedia clips, required readings, assignments, and graded quizzes. There are 12 academic modules, each requiring about 4 hours of time to complete. There will be 2 exams (a mid-term and a final).

**Do I need to be online at a certain time of the day?**

No. These courses are asynchronous. There are no 'real time' interaction requirements.

**Do I need a web cam?**

No.

**When will I be receiving my books/course materials?**

There are no hard-copy materials. All course content is provided through the Blackboard LMS. You will need to have reliable access to the Internet for course participation and research purposes.

**What are the technological skills/requirements for me to participate in these online courses?**

- Ready access to a computer and the internet
- Reliable use of a '**non-.mil**' e-mail address (gimail.af.mil does not meet this requirement)
- PDF viewing software – e.g. Adobe Acrobat Reader (the latest version is preferred)
- Capability to view Flash based video files in your computer's browser
- Capability to open, view, print, edit and submit documents in MS Office formats
- Completion of the Orientation module at the beginning of the course, which covers items such as posting and responding to discussion boards, downloading and uploading files, taking assessments (quizzes & exams) online, and learning to navigate within the Blackboard LMS.

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**How do I sign up for the courses?**

You can apply for all AFCLC education courses through the AU Portal. Instructions are available through each course's web page. Look for the link "Enrollment Directions".

**What is a registration/enrollment window?**

The registration/enrollment window is the time period during which you can apply for a specific course via the AU Portal.

**What if I have to go on a short notice TDY or take emergency leave during the course?**

If you cannot finish the course requirements by the end of the course, you will have to re-take the course in its entirety.

**What if I have to disenroll from the course?**

We encourage careful deliberation by students and expect them to commit to completing the course before enrolling. Every disenrollment represents a lost opportunity to another airman and a waste of Air Force resources. With that said, we understand sometimes it becomes impossible to continue meaningful participation in a course due to unforeseen circumstances.

When the situation warrants disenrollment after 2 weeks into the course, disenrollment requests must be submitted by your commander.

**I previously enrolled in the course but had to disenroll. Can I enroll again?**

Yes.

**What happens if I fail a course?**

If you earn a grade lower than 'C,' no academic grade information is reported to CCAF. So far as your academic record is concerned, it will be as if you never took the course.

**I previously failed a course. Can I take it again?**

Yes.

**How long after a course ends will I get my grade?**

You will be able to see your current score within Blackboard at any time. The course syllabus will detail how to compute the letter grade. However, your final letter grade will not be available until the assessments team has finished its analysis and the instructor has finished grading. While it may appear earlier, you will see your final letter grade no later than 1 week after the end of the academic session.

**How long will it take for my CCAF transcript to reflect the academic credit?**

Final grades are transmitted to CCAF via the AU Registrar within 30 days of the end of the course. The academic credit should appear on your record within 60 days.

**Will I receive a certificate?**

Yes. A course completion certificate and official grade letter will be mailed to the address you provided in your AU Portal account. You should receive those documents 60 days after the end of the academic session. Ensure you maintain up-to-date contact information in your AU Portal account.

**Can I finish early?**

Yes. These courses are self-paced and can be completed as quickly as you like. HOWEVER, due to policies outside our control the academic credit will be transmitted to CCAF along with all others after the end of the academic session.

**Self-Paced. Does that mean I can start whenever I want?**

No. You cannot begin early. Also, you must login to Blackboard, access the course, and complete the pre-course activities within the first week of class or you will be considered a NO SHOW and someone else will be given an opportunity to take your 'seat' in the class.

**What if I'm on Leave during the beginning of the course?**

These courses are not part of your official duties. Your leave status doesn't affect your availability for these online courses and isn't an excuse for being a NO SHOW.

**What if I'm TDY or Deployed during the beginning of the course?**

If you establish positive contact with us via the AFCLC/ESS organizational e-mail box, [afclc.ess@maxwell.af.mil](mailto:afclc.ess@maxwell.af.mil), and coordinate your absence before hand, we will attempt to preserve your seat in the course on a case-by-case basis.

**I'm going to separate/retire during the course? Can I still receive the academic credit?**

No. You have to be Active Duty or participating in the Guard or Reserve component to receive the academic credit.

**I'm going to separate/retire after the course is over. Can I still receive the academic credit?**

It depends on the timing. You should contact CCAF with the specifics.

**I qualify for Project Warrior. Can I participate in these courses?**

Yes. We are still working out procedures for this with CCAF.

**Can I take both of these courses simultaneously?**

Yes. However to maximize participation, priority will be given to those applicants who are not currently participating in another one of our courses.
